Mission Statement



Academic Results & Awards since 2018

- •2022 Leaving Certificate 12% students achieved 625 + points,
- •50% of students achieved in excess of 550 points
- •We were especially proud of our students who would have experienced difficulty in their learning due to a SEN, health or life circumstances. They all achieved to their potential.
- •In 2018, 2 students from Foxrock were awarded the Ad Astra Scholarship by UCD in sport and academics, 10 students the entrance scholars award UCD, 1 student received an entrance scholarship to TCD and 2 students received entrance scholarship awards to DCU.
- •Our teacher Dr Young has been awarded Physics Teacher of the Year by the Institute of Physics in London.
